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Product Description:

Genomic DNA was isolated from a preparation of Escherichia coli (E. coli), strain EH1533, serotype O145.

E. coli, strain EH1533, was isolated from a stool sample of a two year old female during the 2007 verocytotoxin-producing E. coli (VTEC) outbreak in Belgium.1

E. coli. strain EH1533 is reported to have virulence markers VT2, eaeA, ehxA, etpD and the complete OI 122 pathogenicity island.²

NR-10336 has been qualified for PCR applications by amplification of approximately 1500 bp of the 16S ribosomal RNA.

Material Provided:

Each vial contains 4 to 6 µg of bacterial genomic DNA in TE buffer (10 mM Tris-HCl and 1 mM EDTA, pH ~ 7.4). The concentration is shown on the Certificate of Analysis. The vial should be centrifuged prior to opening.

Packaging/Storage:

NR-10336 was packaged aseptically in screw-capped plastic cryovials. The product is provided frozen on dry ice and should be stored at -20°C or colder immediately upon arrival. Freeze-thaw cycles should be minimized.
